(someone who provides some support in return)

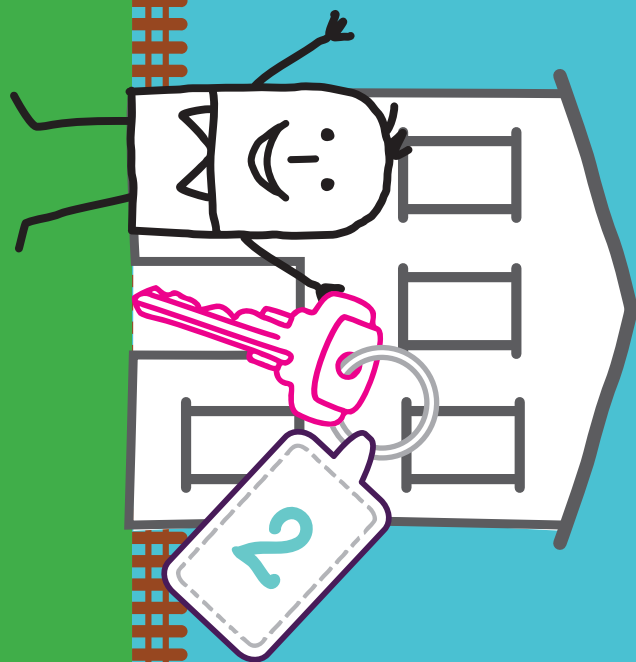

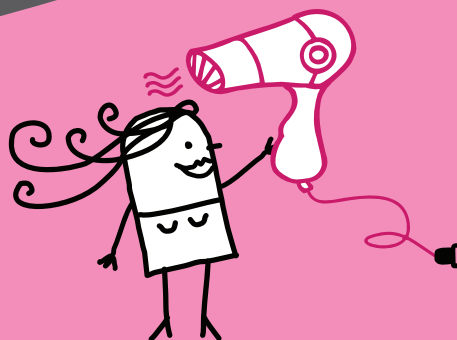

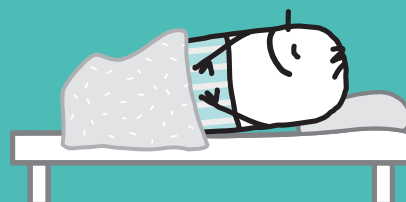


Who are Householders?

As a householder, when you have a spare room to offer, and someone gives you up to ten hours of social support in return – that's a Homeshare.

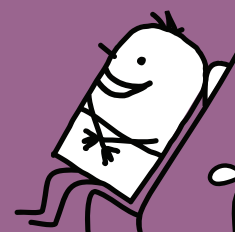
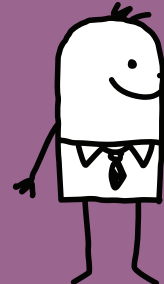
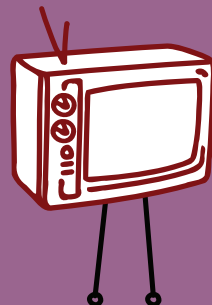

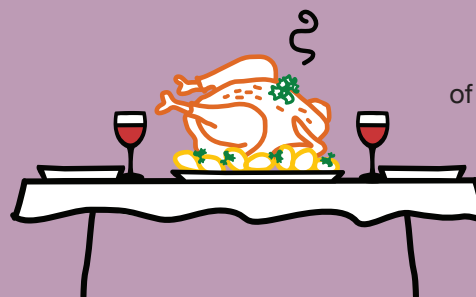
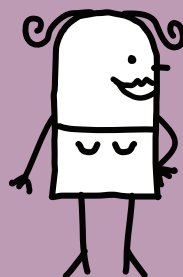
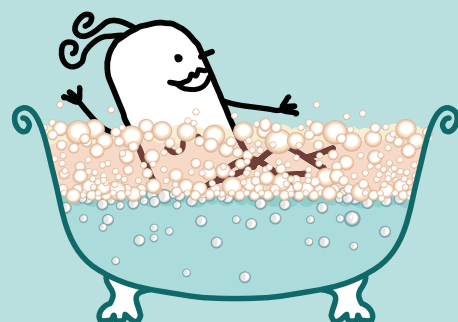
If you have a spare room and are willing to let someone live with you then you could have some really good, personalised support for not very much at all*.

Who are Homesharers?

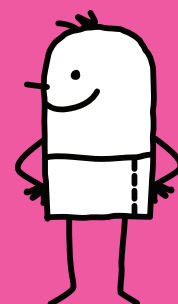


As a homesharer, when someone offers a spare room in return for up to ten hours of social support - that's a Homeshare.

Homesharers giving ten hours of support might just be starting out in life, trying to get on the property ladder, saving for tuition fees, or a whole load of other things.

Homeshare saves you money. If you provide up to ten hours personalised support, you could get your accommodation for not very much at all*.

As well as saving money, Homesharers providing support can put something really impressive on their CV, maybe make a friend for life and open themselves up to all sorts of new experiences.



* Householders and Homesharers pay a small monthly management fee so that we can supervise the arrangement, make sure everyone is kept safe and help with any problems. You may also share utility bills.
